From the Pastor...

Devotion April News Letter

In a few weeks, April 21st, as a congregation, we will celebrate "Shepard Sunday." We will celebrate this together, yet, Psalm 23 is one of the most highly personal passages of scripture. So much of scripture is obviously produced with for a group (synagogue or church) in mind. The grand claims that scripture utters are usually those of the group, praise for our God, our life together, our shared salvation— to spoken as responses in unity and unison.

But Psalm 23 is deeply personal from start to finish. The psalmist is not speaking general religious principles and platitudes like the Proverbs, or ten commandments. He is not telling the historical acts of God and His people in the world. The psalmist is offering personal testimony.

The opening acclamation says it all: The Lord is *my* shepherd. In some places in the prophets, the Lord is praised as the shepherd of Israel. In the Gospels Jesus speaks of himself as a shepherd who cares for the sheep of the fold. Psalm 23 *makes that personal*, unashamedly claiming that God is not only the caring, guiding, protecting shepherd by my shepherd. It's first person singular from start to finish.

Perhaps one implication of this deeply personal psalm is that until the good shepherd, Jesus, becomes your shepherd, *my* shepherd, until God's goodness and mercy is claimed and named as there for you, specifically for you, then God is rather abstract and detached.

A bunch of scholarly types like to waste their time in discussions on the topic, "Does God exist?" Proving one way or the other the truthfulness or fallacy of the answer.

The existence of God is not even a concern. It is really just a distraction, it's not really the question that gets to the heart of our concerns about God. "Does God exist?" is too intellectualized, too detached from the real question we have about God.

And what's the real question we have about God?

It's not "Is there a God?" The real question is: "Does the God **who is** care about me?" or "Is the God **who is**, there for me or not?' That's the question that haunts us.

Psalm 23 gives an unreserved, very personal, engaged response. The Lord is not only *the* Shepherd, *our* Shepherd, but is known to be *my* shepherd.

No wonder that, when we come to the end, and we are lowered into the ground in our death, and mourners surround the grave, we turn to Psalm 23. Those who are grieving, even in their mourning, are deeply comforted by being able to raise their voices, "The Lord *is my shepherd*, I lack for nothing...goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life and I'll dwell in God's house forever."

Perhaps the goal of the Christian life ought to be to live with God now in such a way so that at the end we may be able to say, with our last breath, that in spite of all the twists and turns in our lives, "the Lord, God of all, Creator of the universe, Lord of history, Lord of all Life—that God is **my** shepherd."


Good studies. Great discussion. Wonderful fellowship. All ladies are encouraged to attend. Current study – Ephesians by Dr. David Jeremiah
