From the Pastor...

This Sunday, we'll conclude our three Sundays pondering the depth and width of Psalm 23.

I think sometimes a challenge for our understanding of Psalm 23 is its familiarity. The psalm is filled with rich images. The main metaphor used is God as shepherd. This Sunday, we'll consider the psalm's shift from the loving, guiding, protecting shepherd to the shepherd as the one who keeps working to be sure that the sheep stay in the fold.

The good shepherd image is given in the first three verses of the psalm. A key thing that the shepherd does is to lead in "right paths" (v. 3). The psalmist is depicted as a traveler crossing perilous terrain. Throughout the psalm, it is affirmed that God is trustworthy and can be particularly trusted to lead and to guide through every threat.

The shepherd can be trusted to provide good green pasture grass, to keep the sheep safe and secure in their travels, and to guide them along protected paths. In other words, the good shepherd provides for all of their needs, "I shall not want." The sheep can put their complete trust in the shepherd because the shepherd is completely trustworthy.

One can easily see why this psalm provided some of the strongest and most descriptive images of Jesus in John 10. (also see Luke 15:3-6.)

Though we walk through "the deep darkness of the valley," we can walk with confidence knowing of the work of the shepherd.

"Yes, goodness and steadfast love will pursue me all the days of my life, and I will live in the LORD's house forever."

I know that's not quite how our English versions passively state verse six of Psalm 23 as "goodness and mercy following along" where you lead them. Yet, a more faithful, and Christ visioned descriptive translation would be: "goodness and faithful, unfailing love will **pursue me."**

Pursue, the Hebrew word *radaph*, is a much more intense word than the way most of us memorized the Psalm as "will follow me all the days of my life." The word tends to be used in a negative sense in various places in scripture, for instance in Joshua 8 where the word is used five times where "pursuit" is connected with killing. And yet in Second Kings 5:21, it just means to go after

somebody, to chase them down, not necessarily for evil intent, as when one person runs after someone in order to have a conversation with them.

In speaking of goodness and mercy, or more literally "goodness and *chesed*, God's steadfast covenant faithful love," the psalmist is attributing agency and initiative to God. "Follow" sounds more passive, like a mere tagging along. To have God's love portrayed as dogged and determined in pursuit of us is quite different.

This Sunday we'll amplify this most beloved, familiar psalm, and focus on that word rendered as "follow", while speaking of the goodness and mercy of God. We'll look at a less passive translation of the word as we see God acting toward us to "pursue." To render this word in that way opens up new insight into an old, familiar friend of a Psalm as we see a God who abandons all cost to pursue and claim us to live in his house forever.

This Sunday's assigned gospel, John 15:9-17 ("I chose you"), is a perfect link to Psalm 23. Jesus, the pursuing God, the seeking, searching Savior, promises to keep loving us and also to keep urging, commanding, us to love one another. That's a fitting link with our emphasis on the pursuing God who is love, ultimate perfect love.



About Our Organist

Leonard Lutz has been involved in music all his life. As a baby, he would make his own music as soon as the radio was turned off for the night. By the age of 2, he was playing the record player. In the second grade, Leonard started his "formal" training on the piano, which he managed to do for only 6 months due to getting headaches whenever he went to his piano lesson. He continued to play and practice under his mom's tutelage.

In the third grade, he started trombone lessons and had to use his foot to reach the longer slide positions. That was the beginning of Leonard's interest in learning as much as he could musically. Along



the way, he picked up banjo, 12-string guitar, baritone, French horn, and trumpet. When he was a high-school junior, the school bought a bassoon and Leonard was interested in learning it. That was his first woodwind and has been his favorite instrument to this day.

Attending Pacific Union College as a Music Major, he took lessons on piano, organ, voice, and classical guitar all while supposedly being a "Diversified Low Brass" major. He continued playing as many instruments as he could get his hands on. Unable to decide on an instrument on which to specialize, he turned to Music Education, then switched to Communications with Broadcast Emphasis. He had been working at the college's radio station as an assistant engineer and went on to become the music director, programming all of the station's music. In 1977, Leonard received his BS in Communications with a minor in Music Education. His minor recital was on classical guitar.

He has been a classroom teacher and director of school music programs since 1981. He currently is also director of the Grande Ringers handbell choir at Arroyo Grande First United Methodist Church and organist for Peace Lutheran Church.

In addition, Leonard still plays many instruments and can be found playing a few of them at different times with the San Luis Chamber Orchestra. His wife of 45 years, Jeane, supports and encourages his musical endeavors.
